Dear Colleague,

The New York State Department of Health Bureau of Early Intervention is pleased to announce the release of four documents related to the use of Qualified Personnel (QP) in the Early Intervention Program. The documents are:

- *Early Intervention Qualified Personnel Guidance Document*
- *Qualified Personnel Questions and Answers*
- *QP MATRIX*
- *Early Intervention Qualified Providers Documentation Requirements*

The documents provide clarification about who can deliver Early Intervention Program services, what services each professional can deliver, supervision requirements, and documentation requirements in the Early Intervention Program. The documents provide statewide program guidance to promote consistency in service delivery, align with Early Intervention Program regulation and the Early Intervention Program Medicaid State Plan (18-0039), and provide clarification for any changes from current practice.
