


Virtual and out-of-state attendees hailed from 88 cities in the 15 states highlighted above (excluding New York State). International attendees hailed from Canada




AIDS Institute and Community Based Organization staff were the most represented among respondents




Capital District and New York City were where most of the respondents reside

Recognition


- My viewing of the AIDS memorial quilt was very impactful. When I think of all of the love that went into making every inch of it and for those who are no longer walking among us, is very touching.

Breakout and Plenary Sessions


- > The personal testimonies really impact me. I love those panels.
