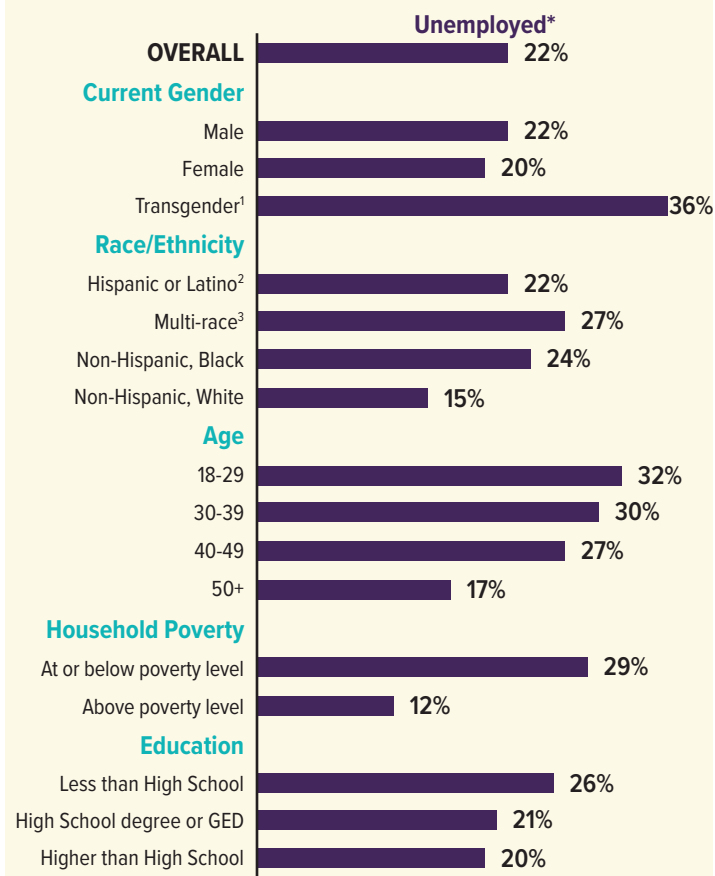


Unemployment Among Adults Living with Diagnosed HIV

Medical Monitoring Project, New York State 2018-2022

The Medical Monitoring Project (MMP) is a locally and nationally representative surveillance system funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The project survey collects data on a probability sample of adults with diagnosed HIV across the United States, inclusive of state and city health departments. Between 2018 and 2022, 1,926 individuals living with HIV participated in the MMP in New York State (NYS) (including New York City).

Unemployment among adults living with diagnosed HIV differs by demographic characteristic



Note: Percentages are weighted; only the percent for those who responded in the affirmative is presented.

*Unemployed includes individuals who reported being unemployed at the time of the interview (excludes individuals who were unable to work).

**NYS and National unemployment is expressed as a percentage and is calculated by dividing the estimated number of unemployed people by the total labor force.

¹Persons were classified as transgender if sex at birth and gender reported by the person were different, or if the person chose transgender in response to the question about self-identified gender.

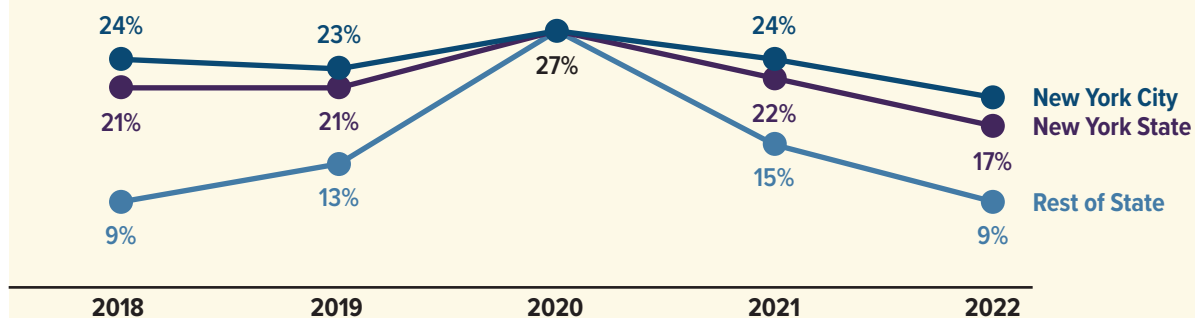
²Hispanic or Latino individuals can be of any race. Persons are classified in only one race/ethnicity category.

³American Indian/Alaska Native/Asian/Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander/multiracial.

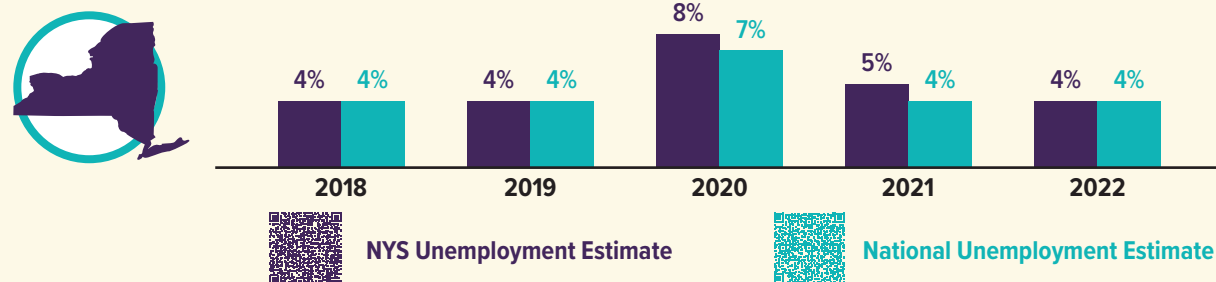
22% or roughly 1 in 5 adults living with diagnosed HIV in NYS reported being unemployed during 2018 to 2022. While differences in measurement prevent direct comparison, unemployment among people with HIV was substantially higher than unemployment among the New York State labor force (5%).



Unemployment among adults living with diagnosed HIV increased in 2020 but, by 2022, was at or below 2018 levels



During 2020 and 2021, unemployment among the NYS labor force was higher than the national estimate**
