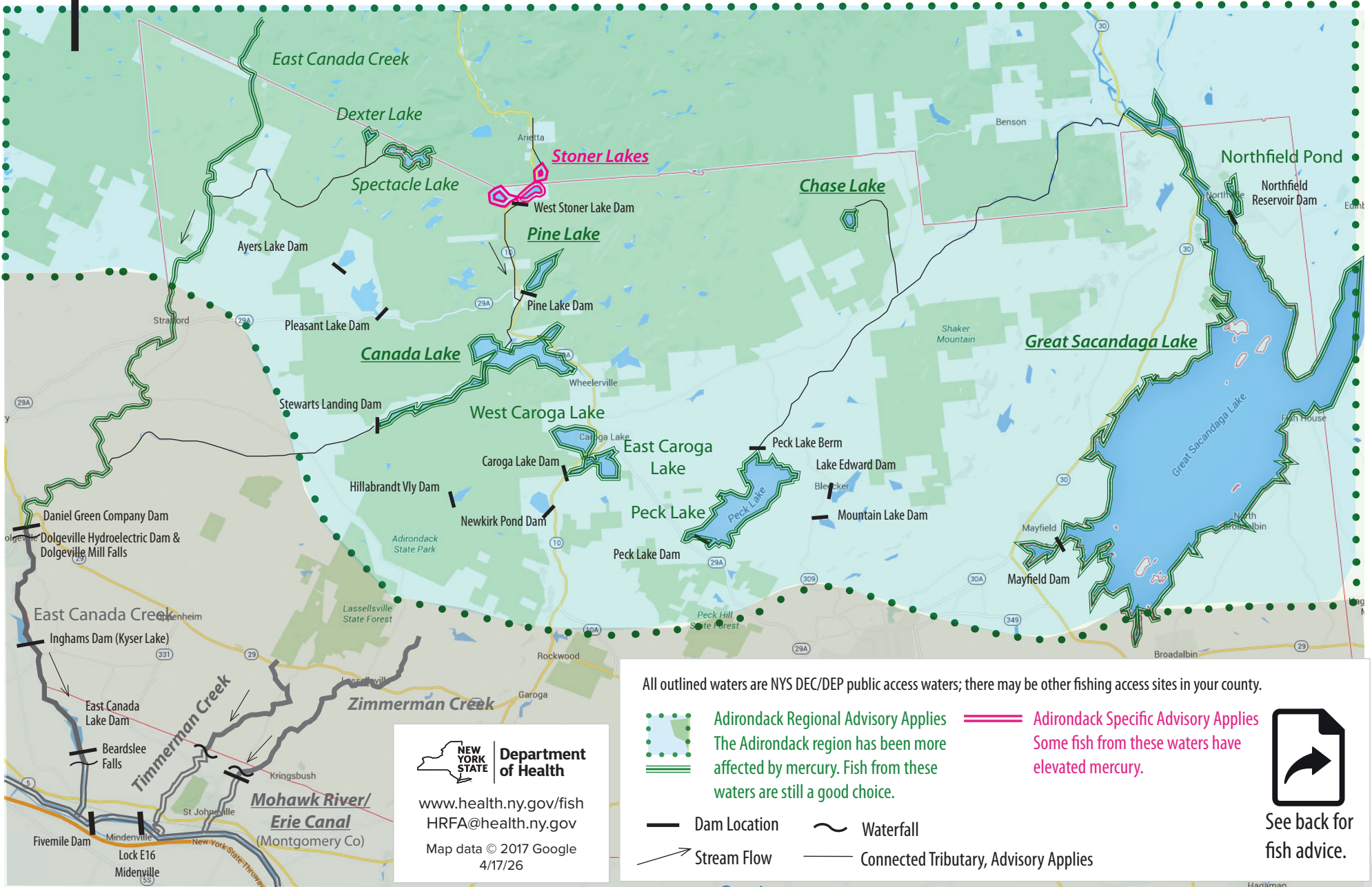








Fulton County Fishing Waters

-  Connected Tributary, Advisory Applies







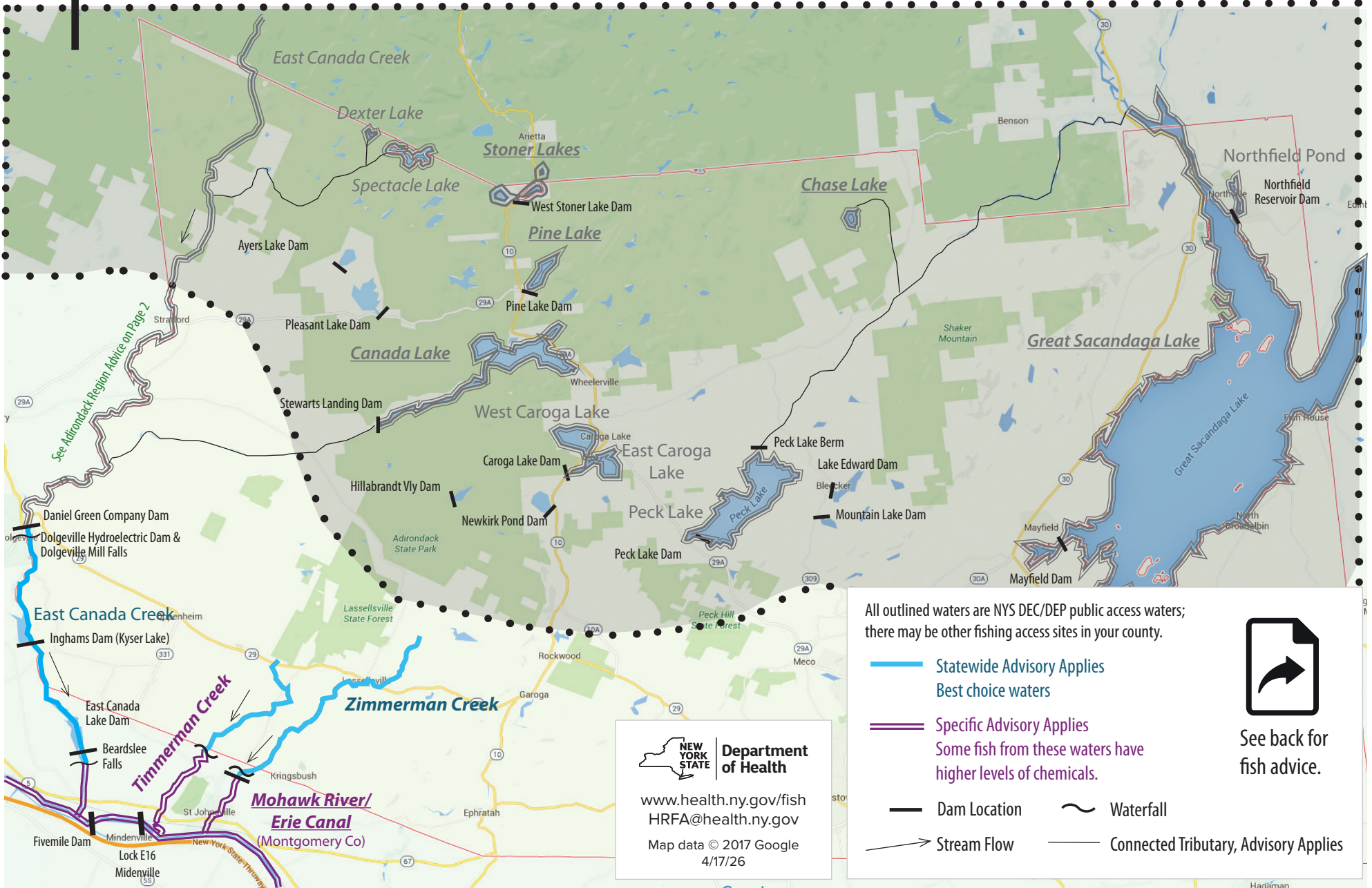
