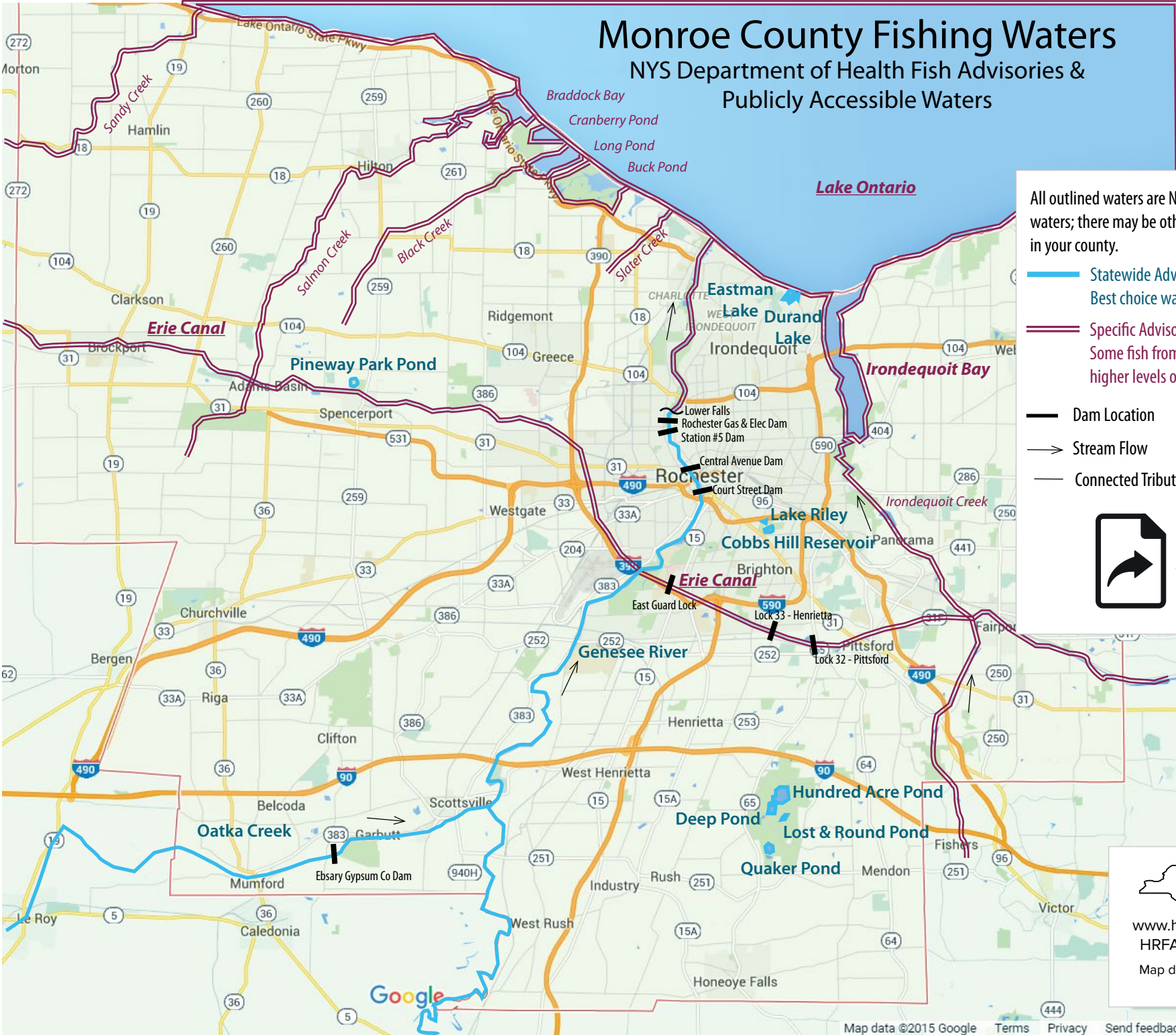











Monroe County Fishing Waters
