DOULA SERVICES PILOT SUMMARY

- The New York State Department of Health (Department) evaluated the Medicaid doula services pilot for reach, effectiveness, and enrolled doula and Medicaid member satisfaction.
- Maternal outcomes evaluated included breastfeeding rates and adherence to postpartum visits.

Medicaid covers doula services. Is a doula right for you?



What is a Doula?

- · A doula provides physical, emotional, educational, and non-medical support for pregnant and postpartum persons before, during, and after childbirth or end of pregnancy.
- Doula support should not replace medical care with a licensed provider

What Services Does a Doula Provide?

Doula services may include:

- . The development of a birth plan;
- Ongoing support throughout the pregnancy;
- . Continuous labor support during childbirth;
- · Education and information on pregnancy, childbirth and early parenting;
- . Assisting with communication between you and your medical providers, and;
- . Connecting you to community-based childbirth and parenting resources.

Am I Eligible for Doula Services?

- If you are a New York State Medicaid Member, you are eligible to receive doula services with each pregnancy.
- . You can receive up to 8 doula visits before and after your pregnancy and support during childbirth - no matter how your pregnancy ends.
- . You can receive doula services up 12 months after your pregnancy ends.

How Much Will Doula Services Cost Me?

· Doula services provided by Medicaid-enrolled doulas will not cost you anything.

A doula can help you during and after your pregnancy and offer labor support.

All Medicald members can receive up to 8 doula visits during and after pregnancy and doula support during childbirth - no matter how the pregnancy ends. There is no cost to Medicald members for doula support.



BILLING UPDATES

Top 5 Reasons for Denied Claims with Edit Codes:

- 1. DUPLICATE CLAIM IN HISTORY (00705)
- 2. PREPAID CAPITATION RECIPIENT SERVICE COVERED WITHIN PLAN (DENY) (01172)
- 3. CLAIM SUBMISSION DATE NOT WITHIN REQUIRED TIME LIMITS (00068)
- 4. RECIPIENT INELIGIBLE ON SERVICE DATE (00162)
- 5. PROCEDURE EXCEEDS SERVICE LIMITS (00712)

Edit/Error Knowledge Base (EEKB) Search Tool

FIND EDIT INFORMATION to crosswalk the X12 Codes (Claim Adjustment Reason Code-CARC; Remit Adjustment Reason Code-RARC, Claim Status Codes-CS) received on the X12 835 Remittance or the X12 277 Claim Status Respose to an eMedNY edit. Use this search tool to obtain explanations, potential causes, and possible solutions to the failed edit.

NOTE: Only edits that may deny a claim are included in this tool. eMedNY proprietary edits are not available on the 835 Remittance. Pharmacy only edits (NCPDP) are not included in this list unless they are a global denial edit (example 00705 for Doulicate Claim).

TO SEARCH FOR AN EDIT filter the results by using one of the following methods:

- 1. The 5-digit eMedNY Edit Number found on Paper/PDF Remittance, OR
- 2. Electronic/835 Remittance, Claim Status (277/ePACES) codes, OR
- 3. Text contained in the Edit/Error Description

CAUSE:

- There is a claim in the paid history file for this patient and this provider for this date of service and procedure or rate code. The claim was previously paid to the provider or group, which caused the denial.
- . If multiple NPIs are linked by the tax ID, the conflicting claim could be paid to one of the linked NPIs.

SOLUTION:

Please review the current and past remittance statements. Even if a claim was paid at a zero dollar amount, it is still considered paid in the Medicaid claim history files and a replacement (adjustment) may be necessary to correct your payment.

- Practitioner: If billing for two or more of the same services rendered on the same date, resubmit an adjustment, on paper with medical notes. You would enter the procedure code on one line, with multiple units.
- Rate-based claims (non APG): If the service was performed multiple times on the same date of service, only one claim is permitted. If multiple procedures were performed, combine all procedures on a single claim.
- APG Billers: If billing for two or more of the same services rendered on the same date, resubmit combining all services performed on that date of service on a single claim as an Episode of Care claim.


