HCS Discontinues Access for Internet Explorer 9 and Windows XP

As of June 1, 2017, access to the [Health Commerce System \(HCS\)](#) was discontinued for all users who have Internet Explorer 9 (IE9) or older versions. In addition, access was discontinued for all users who have a Windows XP operating system.

The Meaningful Use Registration for Public Health (MURPH) System is an application located on HCS, so access was also discontinued to this.
