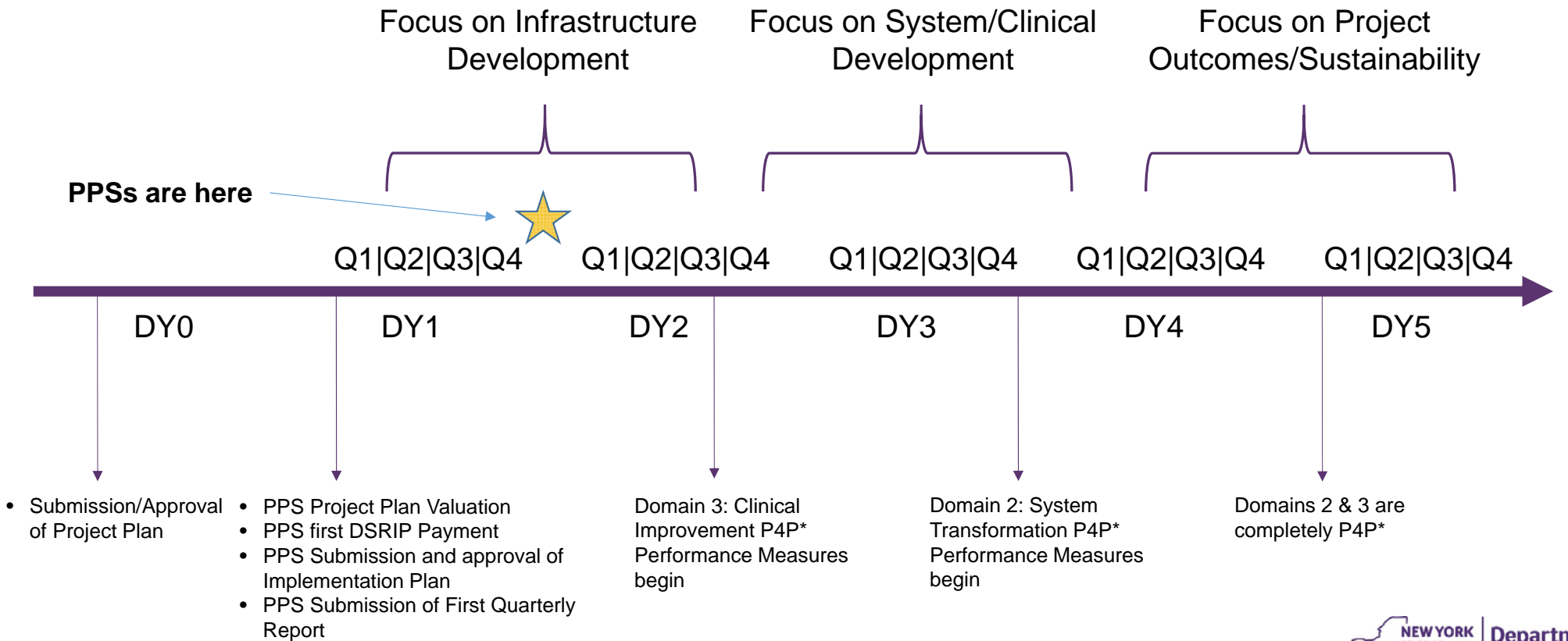
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DSRIP Implementation Timeline and Key Benchmarks

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Domain 4 Overview

March 24, 2016

DSRIP milestones are organized into four domains, of which one is Domain 4 Population Health

- The **four Domains** represent groupings of project milestones and associated outcome metrics
- PPSs **report on progress and achievement** of metrics and milestones and are **evaluated using quality measures** associated with their chosen projects across all five demonstration years (DY1-5)

DOMAIN 1: Overall Project Progress

Includes **organizational milestones** (governance, workforce, cultural competency / health literacy, financial sustainability) and **project implementation milestone** reporting

DOMAIN 2: System Transformation

Projects are **divided between three domains** to meet overall goals of system transformation, clinical improvement and population health.

DOMAIN 3: Clinical Improvement

Examples are:

- *Domain 2, project 2.a.i = Integrated delivery system*
- *Domain 3, project 3.a.i = Integration of primary care and behavioral health*
- *Domain 4, project 4.c.i = Prevent HIV/AIDS*

DOMAIN 4: Population Health

Each project is associated with its own corresponding metrics or measures

Domain 4 is aligned with NYSDOH’s Prevention Agenda and addresses population-wide health

- **Alignment of DSRIP projects** with New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) programs and initiatives
- **Overlap** of Prevention Agenda and DSRIP objectives
- PPSs are **encouraged to work in collaboration** with the community and other providers to address **statewide public health priorities**
- DSRIP plans were required to include **at least one project** from Domain 4
- Funding for Domain 4 is **pay for reporting (P4R)** and **stable over time**
