What is the study about?

This study is about liver cancer diagnosed in Black/African American men and women. The researchers want to learn why Black/African American men and women are at higher risk for liver cancer than others.

Who is eligible to participate?

Individuals who meet the following criteria may be eligible to participate:

- Men and women who are Black/African American
- Diagnosed with liver cancer since 2017
- Between ages 18 and 80 at diagnosis
- Lived in New York State at the time of diagnosis.
