

## Ovarian Cancer Epidemiology, Healthcare Access, and Disparities (ORCHiD) Study



### What is the study about?

The study looked at ovarian cancer in Black and White women. The goal was to learn more about the treatment access, quality of life, and health outcomes for ovarian cancer.

### Who is eligible to participate?

Non-Hispanic Black and Non-Hispanic White women, ages 20 to 75, who live in New York State. Must have been diagnosed with ovarian cancer between 2019 to 2021.
